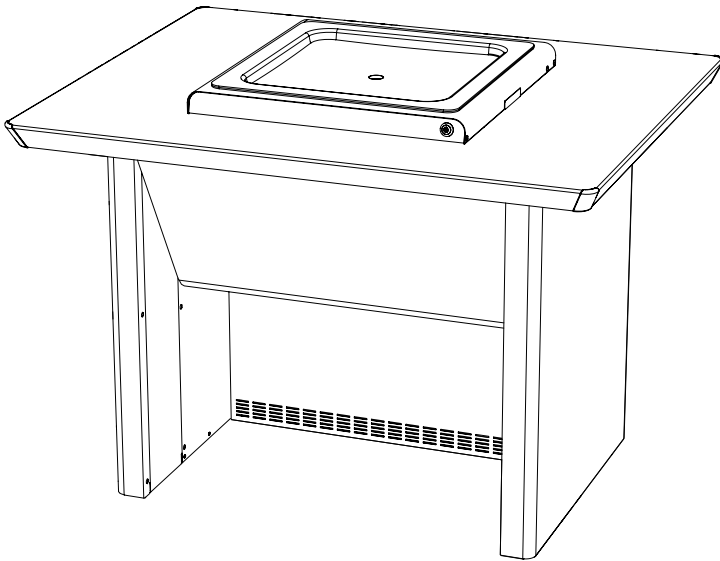

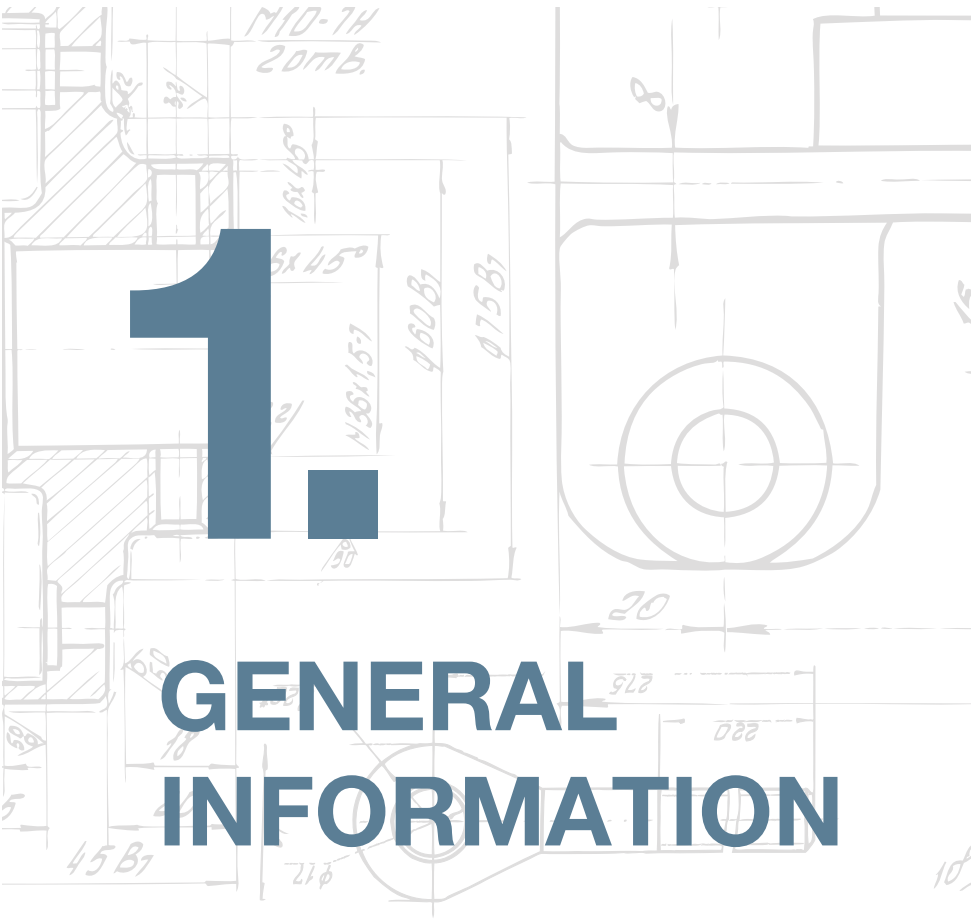

GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1 Safety instructions

Risk of personal injury

- Altering the product or variation from the original specification may result in injury and void the Product Warranty

- For safety reasons, do not store (LPG) gas bottles inside the cabinet at any time

- Corrosive cleaning products may damage the surfaces and coatings, voiding any warranty claim. Use only non-toxic, pH-neutral cleaning products (with a pH between 6 and 9)
- Products intended for cleaning mild steel may damage stainless steel surfaces and must not be used
- Do not place heavy objects on the benchtop

1.5 Description

- The ICON Series is a robust, durable barbecue cabinet, designed to safely house Christie barbecue cooktops and waste containers
- Cabinets are shipped flat-packed to reduce transportation costs and facilitate site access. They are ready for assembly by following the step-by-step instructions in this manual
- Stainless-steel construction provides ultimate vandal resistance and ease of cleaning and maintenance

1.6 Disposal

- The product does not contain substances considered hazardous to health or the environment, according to current Australian and European directives
- When disposing of the product, please remove and deliver the metal components to an appropriate recycling facility
- Christie appliances are packaged in non-polluting and recyclable materials. Please recycle according to local regulations

2.1 Siting Guidelines

- Barbecue facilities should be installed in plain view, where they can be monitored for safe and appropriate use
- Ensure there are no climbing aids that will allow children access to the cooking surface
- Cabinet doors require a minimum 1000 mm clearance when opened
- Ensure there is at least 1200 mm clearance above barbecue cooking surfaces
- Due to the nature of this product, it requires clear access to all sides. The recommended minimum slab size is 900 mm larger than the cabinet benchtop on all sides
- Recommended slab thickness is 100 mm
- When designing for access and mobility in Australia and New Zealand, please refer to the Australian Standard, AS 1428 (Design for access and mobility)

2.2 Tools required

Important: Do not use an impact driver.

- 10 mm Spanner
- Masonry drill with 8 mm masonry drill bit
- Masonry anchors to suit 8 mm diameter hole (a minimum of 4 anchors required for all cabinets)
- Spanner to suit masonry anchors

2.3 Specifications

Christie ICON Series barbecue cabinets are manufactured entirely from stainless steel for ultimate durability and corrosion resistance.

ICON cabinets are available in #4 brushed stainless steel finish, or powder coated in an extensive range of powder coating colours. The product is designed to allow for several configurations and combinations of sinks and cooktops.

Note: All illustrations and instructions apply only to standard cabinets. Some assembly and parts supplied for custom configurations may vary from what is specified in this manual.

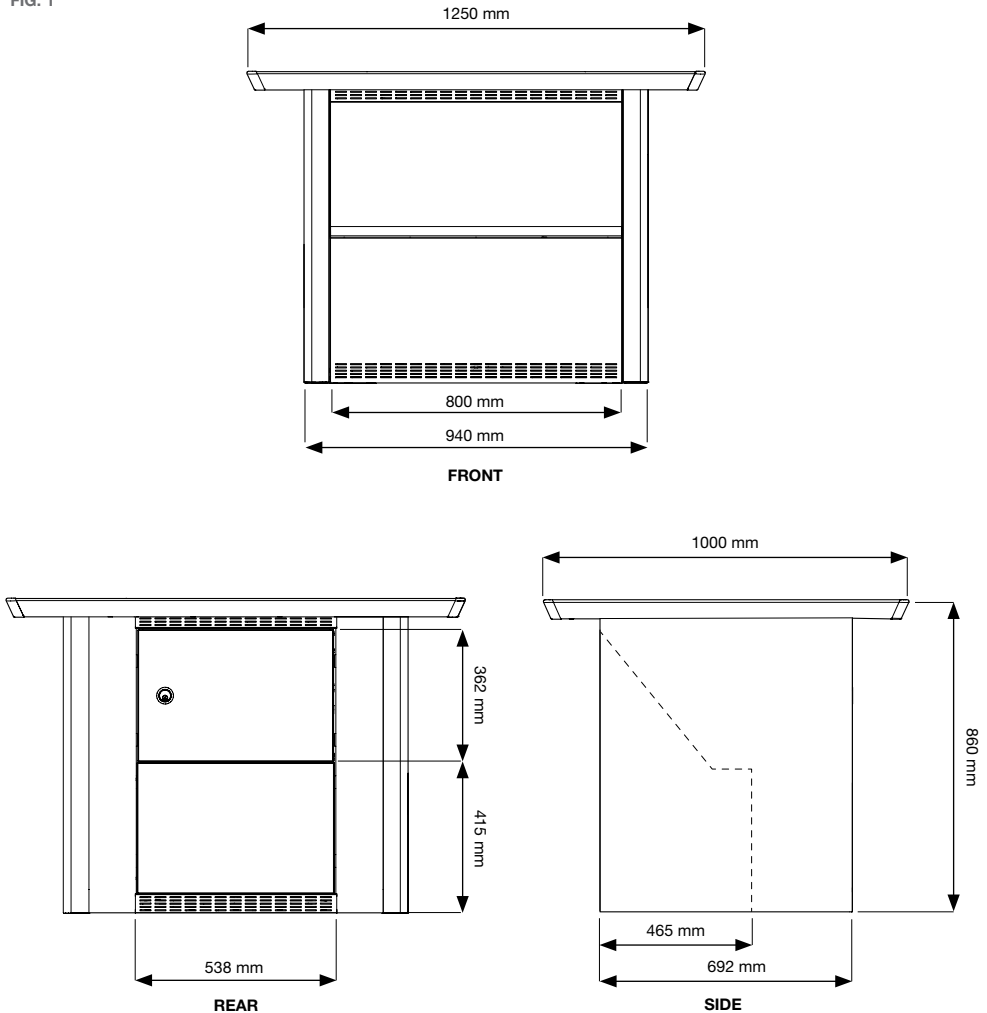

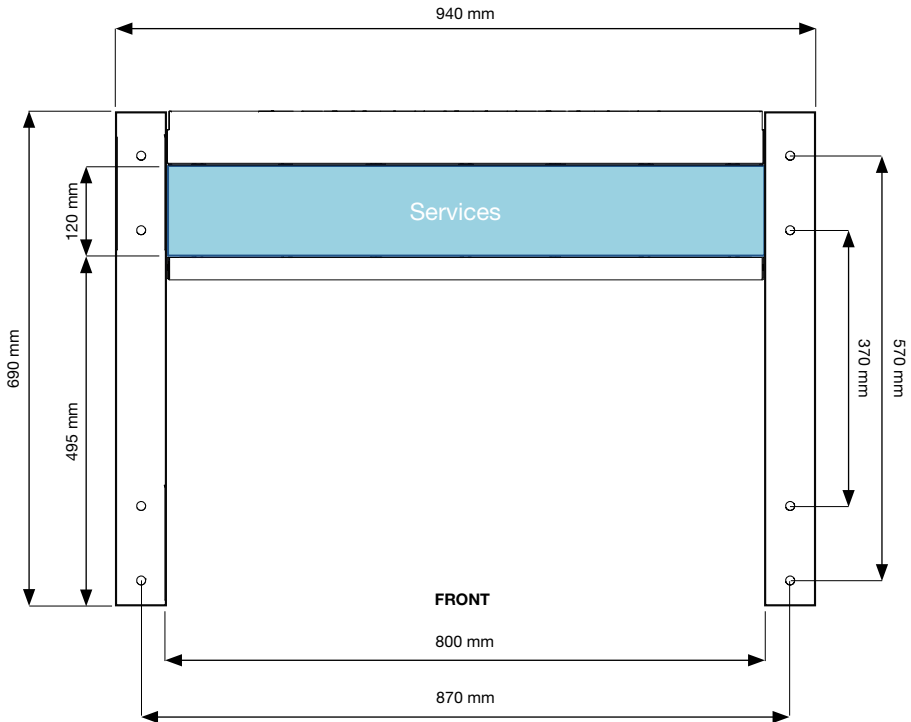

3.2 Standard Cabinet - services and footings

Terminating the services:

Terminate services for standard cabinet configurations in the locations indicated below. These locations will differ, depending on whether gas or electric cooktops are installed.

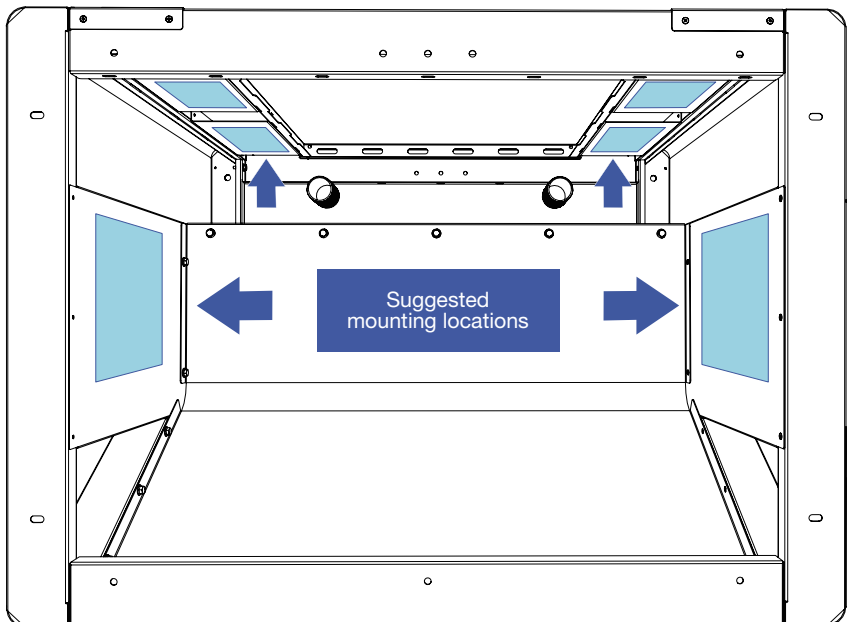
For Christie CC2 Gas Barbecue Cooktop:

- The gas inlet is on the right-hand side when facing the front of the cooktop
- The power supply cable is on the right-hand side when facing the cooktop
- Position the 10A electrical socket (GPO) at least 600 mm above ground (if required)
- Position the battery box on either side of the waste container (if required)

Christie Electric CC2 Barbecue Cooktop:

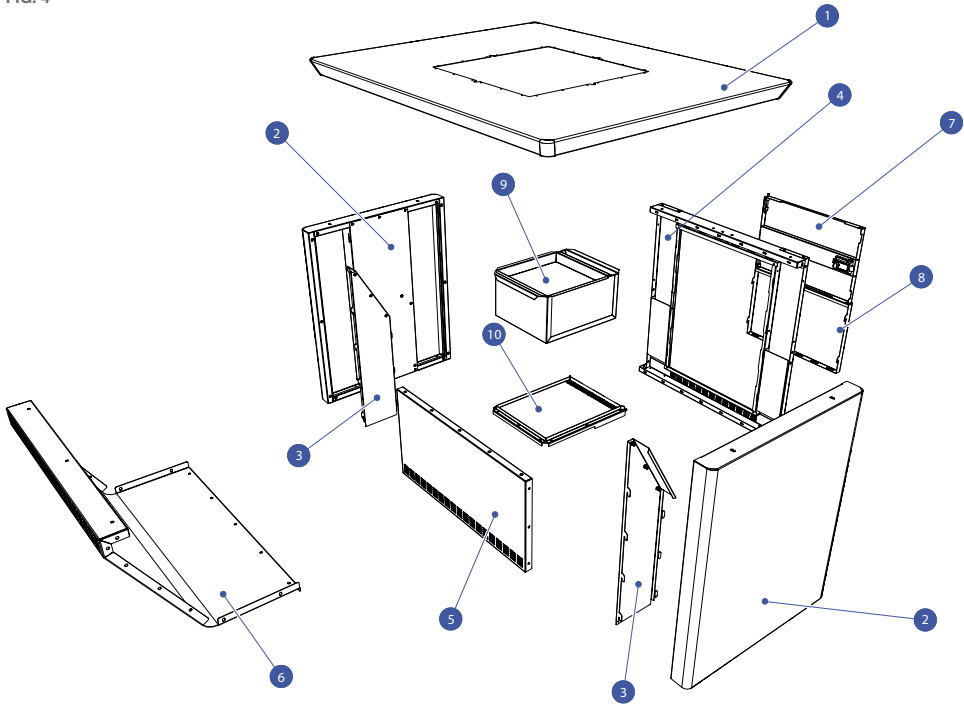
- The 1m electric cable with plug terminates into the left-hand side when facing the front of the cooktop
- Position the 15A electrical socket (GPO) at least 600 mm above ground

3.4 Assembly and installation



Wear suitable personal protective equipment (PPE) at all times.

STEP 1

Open the carton and review the boxed contents section relevant to your product model. Check that all listed parts are present. Contact Christie immediately if you notice any discrepancies.

Note: Leave the benchtop inside the carton until step 8

3.4 Assembly and installation

STEP 2

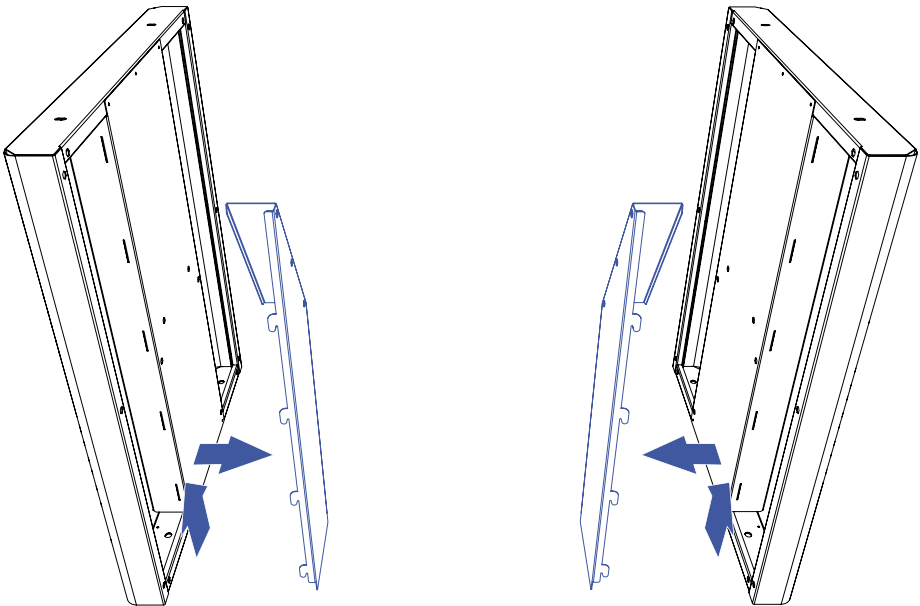


Assemble the cabinet in the final location. Ensure panels are placed in their correct positions before fixing.

1. Locate and unpack the two side panels, foot panel, and rear panel.
2. Remove the in-fill panels from each side panel and set these aside.
3. Assemble the foot panel and side panels. Secure using (4) x M6 bolts. Ensure that the foot panel ventilation slots are on the bottom.
4. Install the rear panel between the two side panels. Secure using (10) x M6 bolts.

Note: Brushed stainless steel cabinets will have a protective film on the outer surface. Peel back the film from internal and adjoining surfaces before assembly.

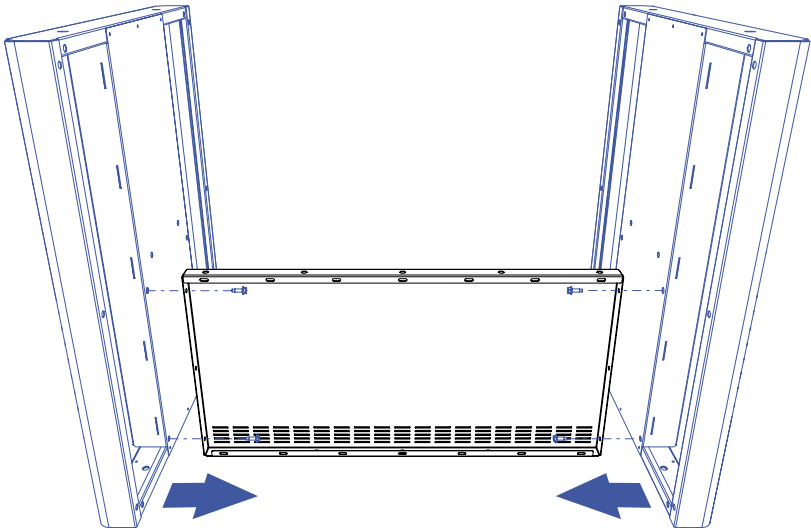
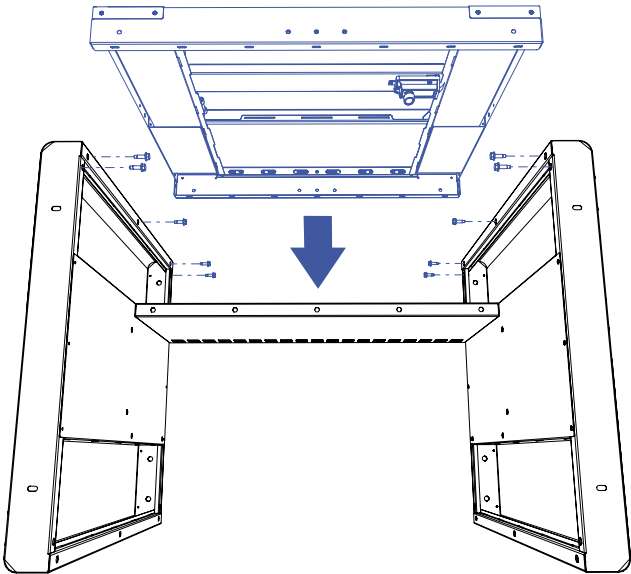

3.4 Assembly and installation

STEP 3

1. Locate the door keys (provided in a bag with these installation instructions) and open the door.
2. Remove the door by releasing the spring-loaded latch pins. Set aside for reinstallation.
3. Remove the lower door panel by sliding the panel upward and then away from the rear panel. Set aside for reinstallation.

Important: Retain the nylon door washer for reinstallation.

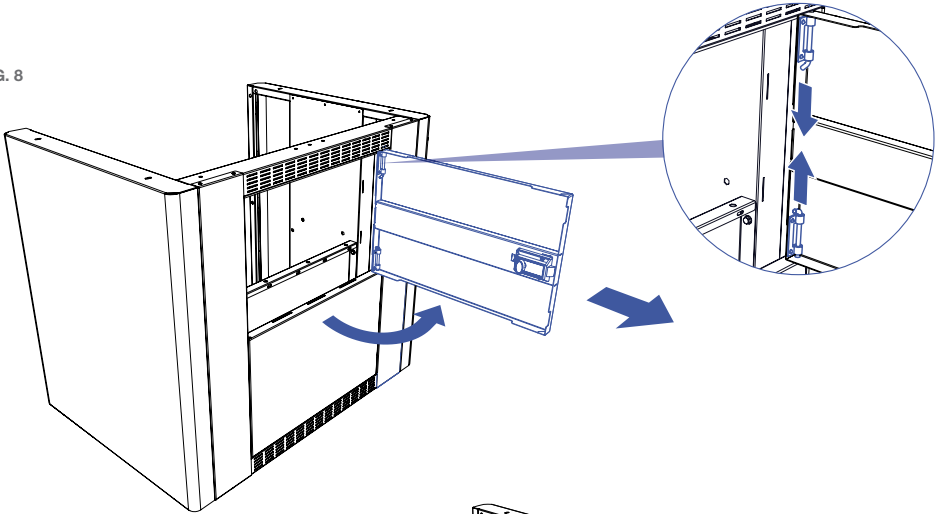
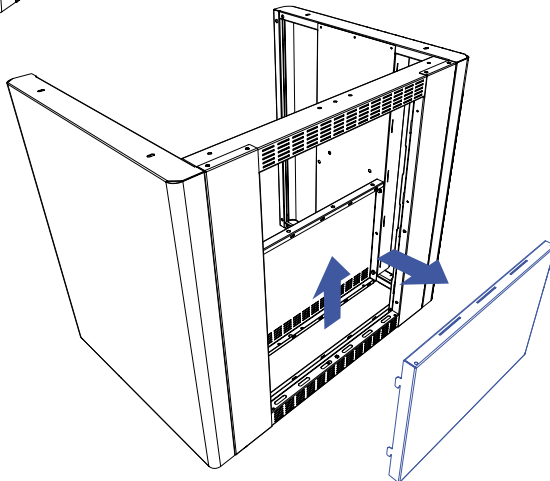

STEP 4

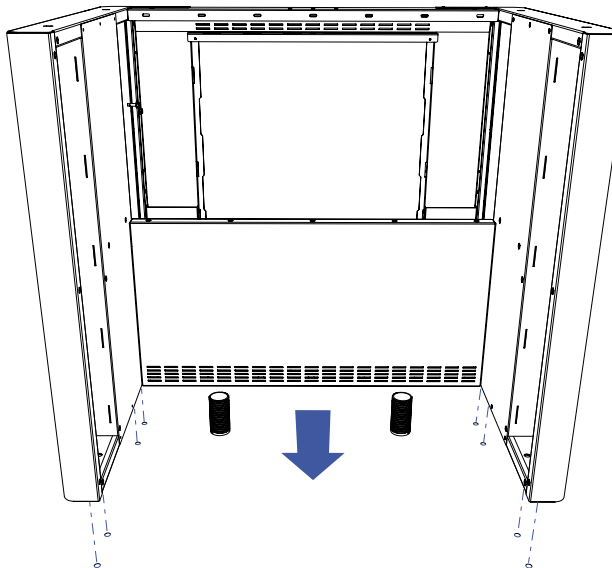


The Cabinet must be square before marking and drilling fixing holes. The internal distance between end panels must be 800 mm (refer FIG 02 in Section 3.2).

1. Place the cabinet in the final fixed position.
2. Tighten all fixings on the rear, side, and foot panels.
3. Mark out the fixing holes.
4. Move the cabinet to one side and drill the fixing holes with an 8 mm drill bit.
5. Move the cabinet back into the final fixing position and align the pre-drilled fixing holes with the frame. Bolt down with suitable masonry anchors.

Important: It is critical to the operation of the appliance that the cabinet is stable and level. Use packers to resolve minor levelling discrepancies or a bed of mortar for larger gaps.

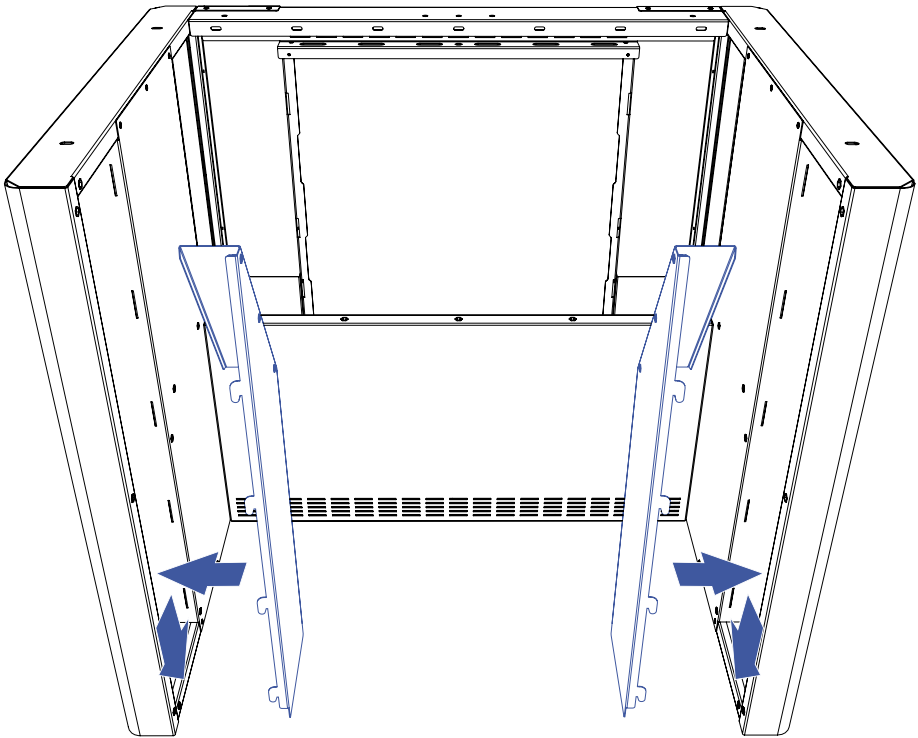

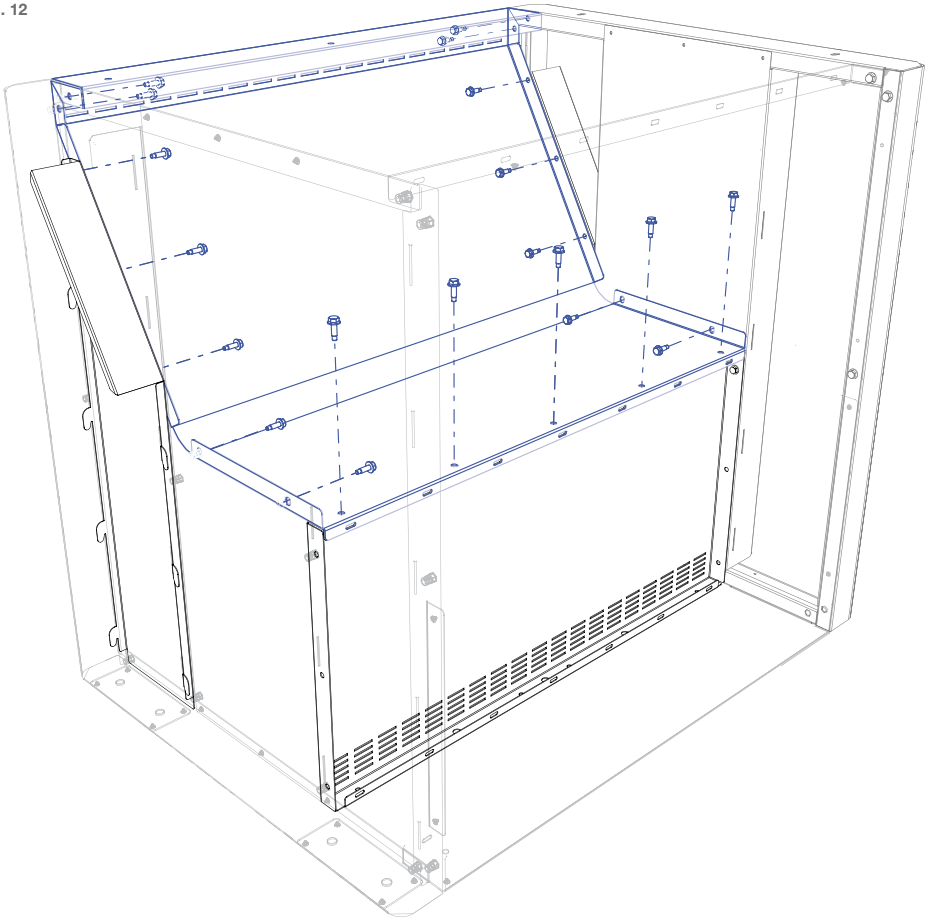
STEP 6

Install the knee panel. Secure using (19) x M6 bolts.

Important: Do not scratch external surfaces when lowering the knee panel.

Note: Brushed stainless steel finish panels will have a protective film. Remove the entire film before installation.

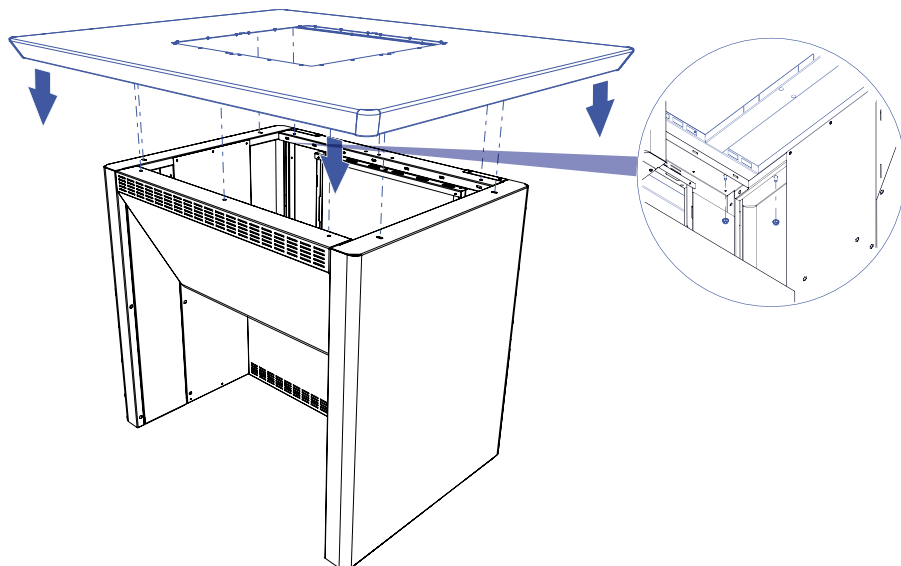
WARNING: Services must only be connected by a suitably qualified person, i.e. electrician or gas fitter.

If your installation has 240v Power outlets (GPO's), install these now. Fix services to internal mounting plates or a secure location. Do not fix to external surfaces (refer FIG 03 in Section 3.2). Complete the gas provisioning (if required).

STEP 8

1. Remove the benchtop from the carton and gently lower it onto the cabinet, ensuring that the pins are inserted into the corresponding fixing holes.
2. Secure the benchtop using the (10) x 6 mm nuts.

STEP 9



Make sure you have the keys and lock the door latch in the “open” position. The nylon door washer must be installed onto the lower spring-loaded latch pin.

1. Reinstall the lower door panel into the rear panel by inserting the locking tabs into the corresponding holes. Slide down to secure.
2. Reinstall the door by inserting the spring-loaded latch pins into the fixing holes in the frame, while ensuring that the nylon washer is attached to the bottom latch pin.

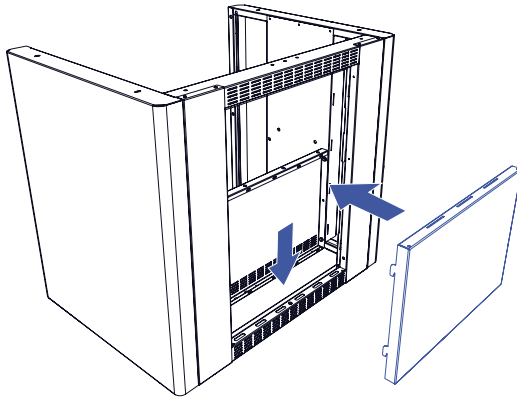
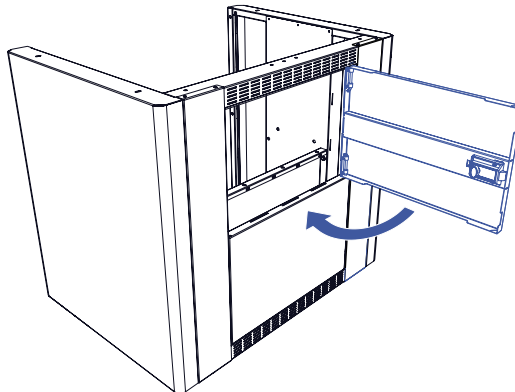

3.4 Assembly and installation

STEP 10

1. Install the waste container mount, using the locating slots in the lower door panel.
2. Slide the waste container into the mount. If you are using a grease trap, ensure that the overflow faces the cabinet door.
3. Close the door, ensuring that the keys are in your possession.

Important: Ensure that the waste container or grease trap is installed and prepared in accordance with the instructions in Section 7.4 of this manual.

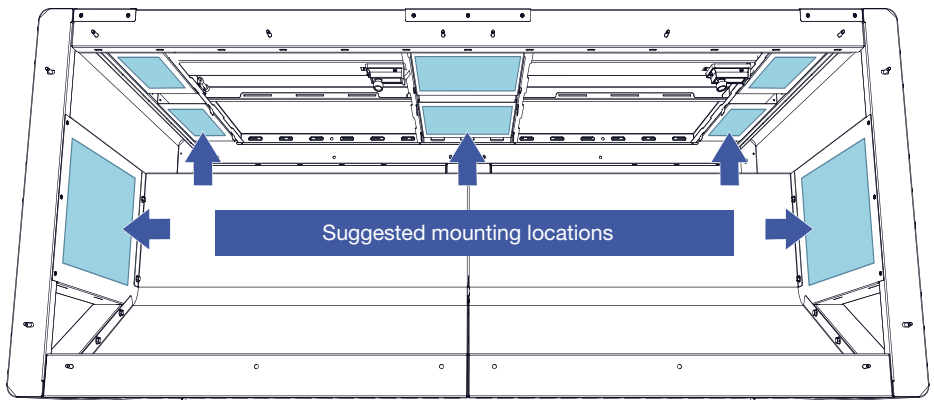
Each Christie CC2 Gas Barbecue Cooktop:

- Gas inlet is on the right-hand side when facing the front of the appliance
- Power supply cable is on the right-hand side when facing the appliance
- The 10A electrical socket (GPO) should be positioned at least 600 mm above ground (if required)
- The battery box should be positioned on either side of the waste tray (if required)

Each Christie Electric CC2 Barbecue Cooktop:

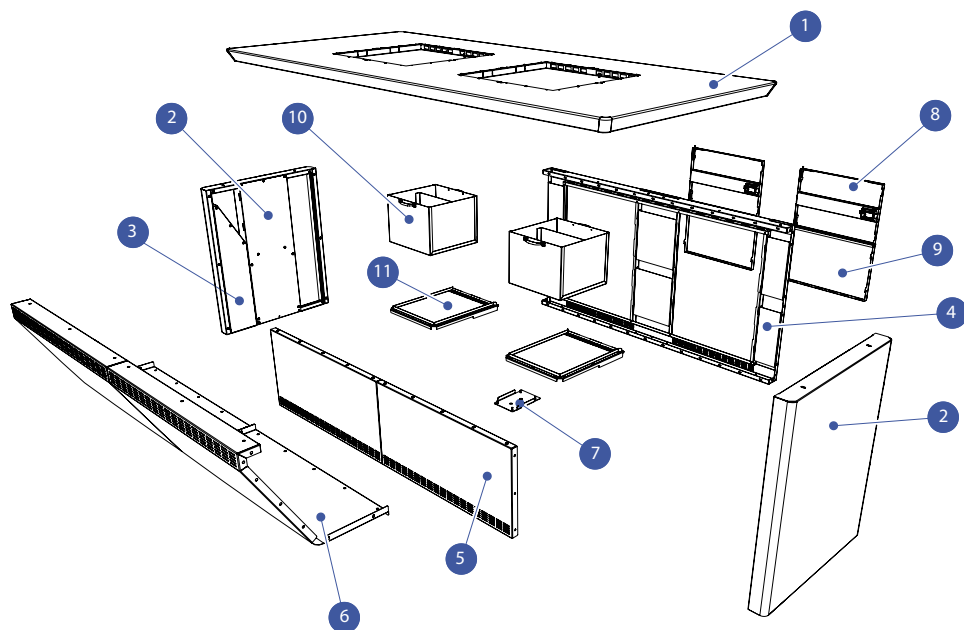
- Electric cable with plug is 1m long and terminates into the left-hand side when facing the front of the appliance
- Position the 15A electrical socket (GPO) at least 600 mm above ground

STEP 1

Open the carton and review the boxed contents section relevant to your product model. Check that all listed parts are present. Contact Christie immediately if you notice any discrepancies.

Note: Leave the benchtop inside the carton until step 8

STEP 2



Assemble the cabinet in the desired final location. Ensure the panels are placed in the correct positions before fixing.

1. Locate and unpack the two side panels, foot panels, rear panel, and centre strut.
2. Remove the in-fill panels from each side panel and set these aside.
3. Connect the foot panels together. Secure using (3) x M6 bolts and nuts.
4. Assemble the foot panels, centre strut and side panels. Secure using (4) x M6 bolts and (2) x M6 nuts.
5. Install the rear panel between the two side panels and over the centre strut. Secure using (10) x M6 bolts and (2) x M6 nuts.

Note: Brushed stainless steel cabinets will have a protective film on the outer surface. Peel back the film from internal and adjoining surfaces before assembly.

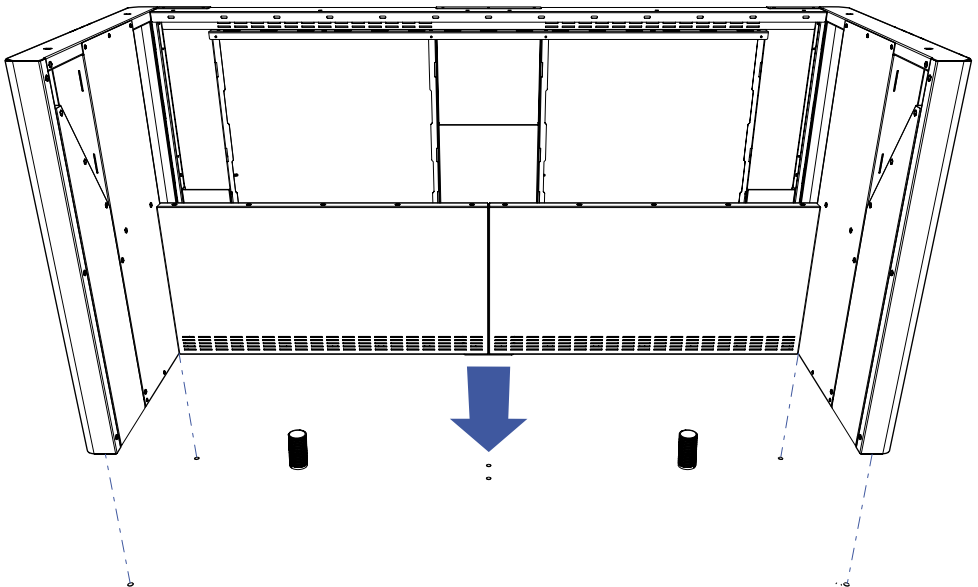


The Cabinet must be square before marking and drilling fixing holes. The internal distance between end panels must be 1600 mm (refer FIG 20 in Section 4.2).

1. Place the cabinet in the desired fixing position.
2. Tighten all fixings on the rear, side, and foot panels.
3. Mark out the fixing holes.
4. Move the cabinet to one side and drill the fixing holes with an 8 mm drill bit.
5. Move the cabinet into the final fixing position and align the pre-drilled fixing holes with the frame. Bolt down with suitable masonry anchors.

Important: It is critical to the operation of the appliance that the cabinet is stable and level. Use packers to resolve minor levelling discrepancies or a bed of mortar for larger gaps.

WARNING: Do not use corrosive cleaning products on this appliance. Use only non-toxic products with a neutral pH between 6 and 9.

Corrosive (acidic or alkaline) cleaners may leave a toxic residue on surfaces, damage electronic circuitry, components, labels, and void the Product Warranty. They may also drastically reduce the life expectancy of the product.

6.1 Safety considerations

- Wear gloves and safety glasses to protect against heat and skin irritation
- Beware of hot cooking surfaces and steam
- Follow all relevant Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) and Safe Work Guidelines

6.2 Environmental considerations

Your local or national Environmental Protection authority should be contacted for advice on how to safely dispose of fats and oils.

6.3 Cleaning and general maintenance

To preserve the appearance and integrity of your Christie barbecue cabinet, we recommend that the entire structure is cleaned weekly and inspected and serviced every 12 months.

1. Spray the benchtop and sides of the cabinet with a mild detergent or pH-neutral, bio-degradable degreaser
2. Rinse with water, or wipe with a clean cloth or paper towel
3. Sweep and wash down pathways around the barbecue. If contaminated with fat or oil, spray with a mild detergent or pH-neutral bio-degradable degreaser and rinse with water

Note: Stainless steel is a low maintenance material that requires regular cleaning, especially in corrosive environments (up to one kilometre from marine waters and up to five kilometres from a surf beach).

Lack of maintenance may result in surface discoloration or “tea staining”. Caused by superficial corrosion, tea staining does not occur if surfaces are washed regularly. In the event that it does, remove promptly - preferably within 30 days – using a “Scotch Brite” or similar non-steel scourer. Staining should occur less frequently after each removal.

The most effective way to prevent tea staining is to ensure that any asset maintenance schedule includes washing and rinsing, to remove salt and dirt.

6.4 Cleaning waste containers

Waste containers must be emptied on a regular basis. Do not allow the waste container to overflow into the interior of the barbecue cabinet. All fat, grease and oil should be disposed of in accordance with local regulations. Do not dispose of it on the ground, as this will create a health hazard.

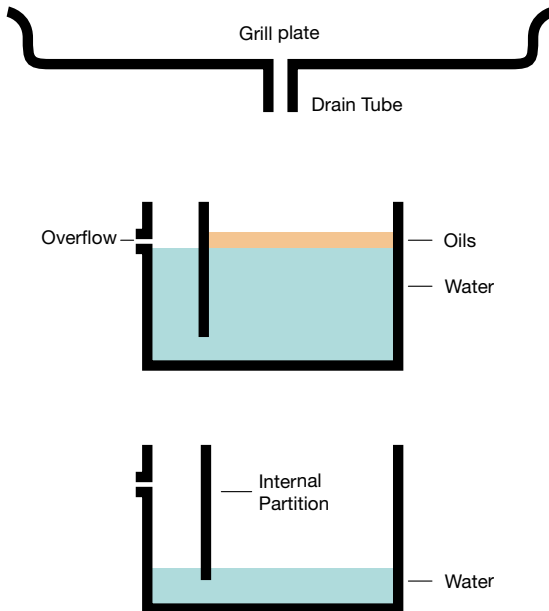
Grease trap

A grease trap is recommended for use in locations where the barbecue is exposed to rain, sprinklers, or other sources of significant water ingress.

The grease trap separates oils and fats from water. Oils float and the internal partition allows water to pass underneath and both chambers of the container to fill, but keeping oils in the large chamber. When the water level reaches the overflow, excess water will drain away and the oils will remain behind.

A container without an internal partition and overflow will progressively fill completely. Oils will overflow, causing cleaning and hygiene problems inside the barbecue cabinet.

6.4 Cleaning waste containers

1. Before use, fill the grease trap with water to approximately 50 mm above the bottom of the internal partition to ensure that fat, grease and oil will be separated from water
2. Place grease trap inside barbecue cabinet, underneath the grill plate. Align so that the main chamber of the grease trap is directly under the drain tube
3. When emptying, skim the layer of oils and fats off the water. Place the fat in a suitable receptacle and dispose of it in accordance with local regulations. Dispose of the remaining contaminated water into a sewerage or other approved disposal system
4. Clean and wash the grease trap with a mild detergent or pH-neutral, biodegradable degreaser, before replacing it inside barbecue surround. A high-pressure cleaner or steam cleaner may also be used. Extra grease traps can be ordered from Christie, to exchange and clean grease traps thoroughly off site

Grease trap: Fill with until the water is above the bottom of the partition

Waste container: Insert the plastic bag into the container and add approximately 1 cup of water

Waste container

Our optional waste container is suitable for locations where grill plates are not subject to water ingress. Water ingress can be prevented by providing shelter over the barbecues or fitting a Christie barbecue hood to the cooktop.

We sell each waste container with a starter pack of 25 bags. Replacement bags are available for purchase in packs of 100.

1. Inserted the specially designed, heavy duty plastic bag into the container. Fold the bag down over the outside of the container
2. Pour approximately 20mm of water into bag before first use
3. When emptying, lift the bag out of the container. Skim the oils off the water. Place the oils in a suitable receptacle and dispose of it in accordance with local regulations. Dispose of the remaining contaminated water into a sewerage or other approved disposal system
